Empowering Women to become self-reliant and take benefit from Government Schemes

Shehri-CBE, in partnership with the Friedrich Naumann Foundation for Freedom under the theme of "Utilizing Government Schemes for Economic Empowerment of Vulnerable Groups', has been engaging with women and transgender communities for their social and economic empowerment. The targeted thematic are includes creating awareness regarding the government schemes for economic betterment.

Through this program, our focus will be to teach the participants about government's various schemes e.g. Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP), Employees' Old-age Benefit Institution (EOBI), and how they can benefit from these schemes.

Benazir Income Support Program (BISP) of government of Pakistan has become largest program, providing social assistance to more than 5.7 million beneficiaries. The BISP is a major segment of social safety nets emphasizing poverty reduction among women and to improve their living standards by providing unconditional financial support to most vulnerable poor women.

Employees' Old-age Benefit Institution (EOBI) is a government of Pakistan scheme, providing for compulsory social insurance. It extends Old-Age Benefits to insured persons or their survivors. Under EOB Scheme, Insured Persons are entitled to avail benefit like, Old-Age Pension (on the event of retirement), Invalidity Pension (In case of permanent disability), Old-Age Grant (an Insured Person attained superannuation age, but does not possess the minimum threshold for pension) Survivor's Pension (in case an Insured Person is expired).

We also aim to connect the participants with people who could help modernize rural micro and small businesses. The session will be held on 5th March 2023 (10:00 am) at Salehpat, moderator and experts will share their knowledge about the government schemes and listen to the ideas of women belonging to the lower income group, helping them in what documents they would need to apply for government schemes and which schemes they can avail in accordance to their aims and plans.
