Local government is an integral part of any democratic system. Being closer to the people, with better knowledge of local issues, by engaging with local communities and citizens, this system helps in finding sustainable solutions for social, economic, and material needs.

The structure of governance in Pakistan is primarily two-tiered: Federal and Provincial. The third tier of governance “Local Government” has not been able to make a significant impact in the political realm of the country since its inception.

In the province of Sindh, owing to its particularly contested political economy space, the damage to grass root governance has been magnified. Political battles fought within the confines of the core institutions of civic governance and service delivery have resulted in institutional paralysis. Powers, functions, mandates overlap and get parked in all the wrong spaces with the result that service delivery has come to a standstill.

Planning and management of cities, that include the provision of water, disposal of sewage and solid waste, drainage and maintenance of public spaces are some of the important responsibilities associated with the agencies of local governance. Moreover, because of its proximity to the people, the local governments are in a better position to ensure that government policies translate into services that will automatically meet the needs of the people.

It is therefore, extremely important that the elected representatives of local government are fully aware of their powers, functions and responsibilities toward efficient service delivery to the citizens.

In this regard, Shehri-Citizens for a Better Environment has organized a “capacity building workshop on Sindh Local Government Act-2013” for the elected local government representatives and officials on Saturday, 7th October 2023 (4:00 pm) at Holy Trinity Church, Saddar Karachi.
